RULES OF COMPETITION

1. All horticultural Exhibits shall be grown by the Exhibitor (except for Floral Art and Children's sections).
2. Exhibits presented at the monthly competition table or October Mini Show are eligible for the Annual Show. Winning exhibits at the last Annual Show may not be exhibited again.
3. Judges are empowered to withhold prizes from any Exhibit not considered of sufficient merit.
4. A Bowl must be round of a greater width than height. A Container is any vessel that can be used for an arrangement (except for Section 4).
5. A Vase, unless otherwise stated, to consist of any number of Stems all round. A Bunch, unless otherwise stated, to consist of any number of Stems to face the judge. . A Container must contain at least 9 blooms.
6. Vases used by Exhibitors in exhibiting shall not exceed 12" (30.5cm) in height or a diameter of 1^{1/2}"-3^{1/2}" (9-29cm) – unless otherwise specified.
7. **ALL EXHIBITS TO BE STAGED BY 9.50am SATURDAY.**
8. **ALL CARE WILL BE TAKEN BY THE COMMITTEE, BUT NO RESPONSIBILITY.**
9. Exhibit Cards to be collected at Hall. NO ENTRY FEE.
10. Judges will give preference to named Exhibits.
11. Pot Plants to be in possession of Exhibitor two (2) months prior to Show. ALSO MUST BE IN POTS. Saucers encouraged.
12. Exhibits must NOT be removed before 4.30pm without prior consent of the Show Manager. Disqualification may occur and prizes withheld.
13. Any Exhibitor desiring to protest must lodge the protest with the Show Manager within one (1) hour of Judging.
14. A Novice is an Exhibitor who has not won a FIRST PRIZE in any Horticultural Show for the Schedule Item, in any class, more than three (3) times.
15. Vegetable section to be judged on vegetable quality and premium growth and not as items of floral art or cut flowers.
16. When Judging, in the event of any uncertainty regarding an Exhibit in relation to a Schedule Item, Steward and Judge to clarify with the Show Manager.
17. The Show Manager may remove an exhibit that is not up to Show standard or infested with insects.
