SOME HINTS FOR EXHIBITORS

- Read the Schedule and ask questions about anything you don't understand.
- Make a checklist of packing and staging on the show bench.
- Start to prepare exhibits at home including naming labels. Condition the plant material well.
- Prepare carefully to transport to the show to avoid damage. Don't forget to include checklist, tools and any containers you are supplying.
- On arrival collect bench tickets and find a work area.
- Stage your exhibits on the show bench checking that they comply with the Schedule Eg. Have the correct section number, are neat, are in the right place, labelled and containers /pots are clean.
- Stewards are usually available to help.
- Try to have enough time to do a final check of your entries so everything is "just right" before leaving the hall at judging time.
- When the show is open, check your entries and also observe and enjoy the rest of the show.
- Don't hesitate to ask questions of the judge, steward or officials.

Remember to enjoy it all. Congratulations on your contribution to the show.

NOTES AND RULES - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

DEFINITIONS

Spray A stem with laterals bearing flowers e.g. Fuchsias, or terminating

in branching shoots bearing flowers e.g. Azalea.

Spike An inflorescence with a more or less elongated axis, usually

unbranched, bearing either stalked or stalkless flowers,

e.g.Cymbidium, Delphinium, Gladiolus.

Stem A single plant structure carrying one or more flowers and buds. It

may be branched e.g. Bearded Iris.

Truss A cluster of flowers growing from one stem, as in pelargoniums,

Polyanthus and Tomatoes.

STAGING

ENTRANTS MUST ARRIVE BY 10 AM ON FRIDAY 8th Mar TO HAVE ENTRIES STAGED BY 11:00AM. The hall will be open 7:00 pm – 9:00 pm Thursday night to stage exhibits. See a steward before staging any exhibit. No exhibits are to be removed from the hall before 4:00 pm Saturday. Interference with another's exhibit is prohibited. Only stewards may move an exhibit if it cannot be judged owing to its position. Containers/vases are available if required but must not be removed from the hall. Posy bowls for floral foam are available if requested when notifying entries. No wiring allowed except in Floral Art and Class B Roses. Would exhibitors please name varieties (cards are available at the show desk).

CONDITIONS

All exhibits, except Floral Art and Snapshots, to be grown by the exhibitor or have been in their possession for more than two months.

The Australian Horticultural Show and Judges' Manual is available from the Society for reference. In general the show is conducted and judged following guidelines set out in the Manual and Australian Floral Art Association Manual. Judges are usually available for discussion with exhibitors after the official opening. Contact the Show Secretaries if you require an introduction.

JUDGES DECISIONS ARE FINAL

NO-ONE is allowed in the hall during judging other than Judges, Stewards and Officials.

The Society will take care but will not hold itself responsible for exhibits etc.

PRIZES

1st prize -\$ 2:00; 2nd prize - \$1:00; unless otherwise stated. To be collected at the show. Additional trophies may be allocated.

Judges may withhold a prize if the exhibit is not worthy.
